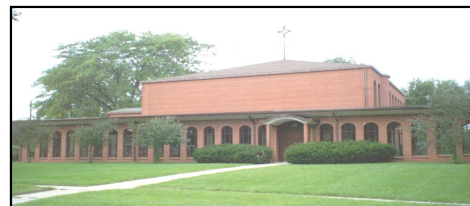

Continuing the Call Process

During the first six months of this year our congregation went through a very intentional discernment process. In February, we held a history day in which we remembered and embraced our past. During the Lenten Season, we went through a period of prayerful deliberation and conducted a congregational survey in which 65 people responded. In April, 83 people participated in small group meetings that lifted up our current strengths and identified areas of potential growth.

In May, the Council developed a written Five-Year Ministry Vision that summarized the discussions of the previous three months. This document identified the characteristics and traits needed in our next pastor so he or she can lead St. Andrew's. On June 6, the congregation unanimously approved the written Five-Year Ministry Vision and elected three At-Large members to finalize the Call Committee.

The ten-member Call Committee consists of Council members Bill Koenig, Betsy Ratashak-Vogel, Ken Israel, Phil Meraz, Jeff Pearson, and Linda Seaverson; At-Large Members Les Carlsborg, Ed Fulk, and Laurie Hoifeldt; and Youth Representative Christina Paulson.

In June, the Call Committee began its work as representatives of the congregation. The committee met with Pastor Eric Carlson of the Southeast Iowa Synod who outlined the call process. The committee's first task was to complete a Ministry Site Profile of the congregation that will be read by potential candidates. This document describes the congregation's history, ministry, membership, community, and leadership needs...all areas that we highlighted during our small group meetings and approved in our Five-Year Ministry Vision.

The Call Committee has been very intentional in following the Five-Year Ministry Vision while completing the Ministry Site Profile. The Profile is now completed and will be posted soon for candidates to see. Printed copies of the Profile will be available in the church office.

The next step for the Call Committee will be to receive candidate names from the Synod office. As we continue this process, the Call Committee will be as open as possible to the congregation, but we will need to maintain confidentiality during interviews.

Your participation in the call process has not ended with the June 6 congregational vote. The Call Committee needs your support and prayers. Feel free to ask committee members questions about where we are at in the process. Contact a Call Committee member if you have a pastor who you would like to be considered for St. Andrew's. We have a form that you can pick up at the church office that can be filled out to identify this person.

In the coming months, I encourage you to be active in worship and service as we plan fall activities. Pastor Cline will continue to lead and prepare us as we complete our call of a new pastor. As we move forward, we trust that God will lead us in the direction that we can best serve him.

Stewardship & Finance – August '10

We have passed the mid-point of 2010, a good time to provide an update about activities and the financial status of our congregation.

The 2010 budget that was approved by the congregation included expense reductions in every category (benevolence, personnel, facilities, and programs). Those expense reductions were based on projected income reductions, which were due primarily to the economic downturn.

Giving for the year is slightly lower than budget projections. The people who spend the operating budget are doing an excellent job of managing expenses. The total cash held by the congregation has decreased in the past six months, but it remains at a reasonable level.

Benevolence has been a high priority for St. Andrew's for many years. That commitment continues. So far in 2010, benevolence contributions have been sent as scheduled to the ELCA, Riverside Bible Camp, Beloit Service Center, and social concerns recipients (Good Neighbor, Emergency Residence Project and Mid-Iowa Community Action (MICA)).

Certificate principal and interest were repaid as scheduled in July.

Several members of the St. Andrew's faith community are facing financial challenges in these trying economic times. Please know that your importance to our faith community has nothing to do with what you are able to give.

Because the congregation's operating costs continue all year, those who are in a financial position to contribute are encouraged to stay current with your giving and to challenge yourselves to increase your giving as you are able.

**St. Andrew's Lutheran Church
Church Council Minutes – July 15, 2010**

The July 15, 2010 meeting of the St. Andrew's Lutheran Church was called to order at 6:00 PM by chairperson, Bill Koenig. Koenig, Jeff Pearson, Betsy Ratashak-Vogel, Sarah Buck, Linda Seaverson, Pat Fawcett, Phil Meraz, Ken Israel, and Interim Pastor David Cline were present. David Krumm was absent.

Koenig lead opening prayer and reflection. Buck agreed to lead in August.

Acceptance of Agenda and Minutes: Pearson moved to approve the June council minutes and Israel seconded; minutes were approved as presented. Israel moved to approve the agenda and Buck seconded; motion approved.

Reports:

- *Financial Report:* Buck, Stewardship and Finance Committee member, presented in Krumm's absence. The following excerpt is from the written Treasurers Report for June 2010. "We are six months into the year 2010. All percentages should be 50%. Anomalies to the percentages were mostly anticipated, and if not, at least explainable. Our cash balance remains strong at \$87,117.34. We are down \$10,222 in cash since the beginning of the year. Taking out the anticipated drop in Prepaid Pledges we have dropped \$2365 so far. Cash in Unrestricted Funds remains strong. June was the lowest income month of 2010 and lower than any month in all of 2009."
- *Pastor's Report:* The Mary Hendrickson funeral, several wedding requests and lots of pastoral care visits have recently taken place. Conversations about plans for the upcoming year of confirmation have taken place and plans for this year include several field experiences for students to visit ELCA centers in Iowa as well as a half day retreat at the commencement of confirmation. Council members may want to consider the practice of sermon notes and how they are handled. Based on current plans, COW will continue this year.
- *Call Committee Report:* Koenig discussed the ministry site profile. It was determined that the Rental House Ministry should be more clearly defined as seven units and that the trend in giving is decreasing rather than increasing.
- *Committee Reports:* Vacation Bible School will begin on July 25. Registration numbers are low and kids are encouraged to bring friends. The Family and Youth Picnic is this Sunday at Moore Memorial Park following worship.

Old Business:

- *Staffing for Family and Youth:* Julie Fulhart has accepted the elementary level programming position and the pay rate is to be determined. The YMT staff from Riverside have not assigned to SALC yet.
- *Recent Email Vote Summary:*

- *Tanzania Fundraiser:* The fundraising requests submitted by the Tanzanian Ministry Team were approved via an email vote on June 12, 2010. “1) Cans for donations in local businesses: We expect to raise \$500 with the cans. 2) Trivia Night: There has been a lot of discussion lately of creating “entry points” so this was planned as an entry point event. It will involve approx. 3 non-members for every member involved, and will be done in conjunction with Fellowship and Outreach Committees. It is a fund-raiser that we expect to net about \$750, but it was mostly designed to be an entry point. 3) Personal Shopping Event: There is no doubt people love to get “things” from Tanzania, and we have many shopping requests when we go, so the idea here is simple. For everyone who makes a donation over \$100 to support our visit, we will do some shopping and bring them back an item of their choice. The bigger the donation, the more substantial the gift can be. We will suggest things such as coffee, shirts, art, or carvings, but they can choose what they like, as long as the price is reasonable and the size is small. We anticipate this to be VERY popular, and hope to raise between \$1,000 and \$4,000 with it from both the congregation, and some loyal supporters outside the congregation.”
- *Credit Card:* The credit card item was approved on July 6 via an email vote. “Previous staff has had their names on the church’s credit cards. We need to replace our credit cards. We are going to get "universal" credit cards. These cards will have no individual's name on them, but will have the church’s name on them. Only pre-authorized staff or members will be allowed to check out and use the cards for St. Andrew's activities.”
- *Policy Review Committee:* Sheri Krumm, Chair, Dave Putz and Pat Fawcett are members of the Policy Review Committee. Progress will begin in about a week.

New Business : Non-Action items

- *Membership Roll Letter:* Council reviewed the letter prepared by Seaverson to begin the process of renewing the membership rolls at SALC. Council recommended that the term ‘active member’ be replace with ‘member’. The letter will be sent approximately August 1.
- *Rental Housing and Property Management:* The current individual bearing the majority of the responsibility for the Rental House Ministry wishes to step down from that role. The responsiveness of Martin Property Management is not as prompt as desirable. The Rental House Ministry Committee will meet in the near future to respond to these events.

Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 7:43 PM following the blessing and sending.

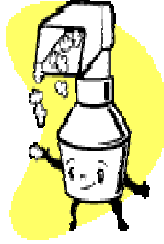

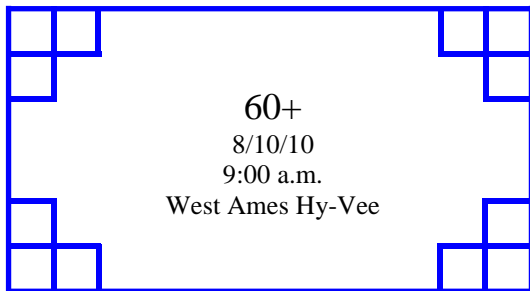

St. Andrew's Gives

St. Andrew's Lutheran Church's Foundation is as Sturdy as Ever — Generated \$388 Million in One Year!

Oh, wait a minute – this headline is about the ISU Foundation, not St. Andrews!! Think about it, wouldn't it be cool if we could generate even 1/1000 of that amount -- \$388,000. Putting this amount into an endowment which preserves and grows the principal amount could give us \$20,000 (conservatively) each year in interest earnings to use for carrying out the various missions of St. Andrews. This seems appropriate in times like these where our church leadership has had to make some tough decisions on what to cut. And, how about our church building?? When was the last time we have made an update of any substance? When haven't we robbed from the building maintenance fund to meet other needs? It is going to catch up with us one of these days.

The EMF (Extended Ministry Fund) works on a very small scale to achieve some of the "extra ministries" of St. Andrews. Very small!!! Revenues come in from memorials and assorted other donations. Some things that have been funded recently are: a new refrigerator, a beamer (projector) for the education committee, scholarships to St. Andrews students going to ELCA schools, help for the "Women with Bibles" retreat, the columbarium, and other miscellaneous accomplishments.

In our recent discernment process, a few important initiatives came out for our future. It would be wonderful to have an established endowment that could support some of these initiatives and make St. Andrews an important and growing resource for our community. Expect to hear more about establishment of an endowment fund to support and grow St. Andrew's mission work.
